From your Parish Council



A big thank you to the villagers and Parish Councillors who attended the Village Litter Pick and Path Clearance on 20th March. Special thanks to Cllr Gordon Lane for his hard work clearing the debris from the footpaths along the A148; to Peter from Beech Close who joined us for the first time; and Ray Morgan of Avenue Rd for his experience and first aiding. We managed to cover the whole village. We didn't enjoy our usual refreshments and socialising at the end, giving this up to facilitate a Ukraine fund raising yoga session in the Village Hall. The whole experience was enhanced by the beautiful display of daffodils throughout the village, complementing the colourful flower tubs. Thanks again to Parish Councillor Susan Rutherford and others.

On Friday 18th March, I attended the Queen's Jubilee planning group meeting. Lots of effort is being put into this event. It truly promises to bring villagers together in celebration; your Parish Council is sponsoring the activities and we hope to see you at the events. Well done to Cllr Maureen Pearman and all involved.

Our March Parish Council meeting was attended by Cllrs Eric Vardy and Stefan Aquerone. Cllr Vardy described the current work and priorities of both the District and County Councils. Full details are available on your Parish Council website. Cllr Aquerone, who represents neighbouring Bodham, consulted us on ongoing matters around the SAM2 device that monitors and displays speeds along our, and other, sections of the A148. As you will be aware from previous reports, we are seeking to purchase or otherwise acquire a SAM2, as the one we have use of is shared by a number of local Parishes. This means we get use of it for only a maximum of six to eight weeks a year. We will keep you informed of progress.

The Parish Council received a presentation from Sean Doran regarding its Big Plan. Complementing the Village Hall Management Committee's draft plans to improve the Hall, which includes the environment, the Parish Council has adopted a proposal in principle by Cllr Patrick Kelly to work to make High Kelling even greener in all senses of the term. We intend to do this in close liaison with the Hall. One specific issue is currently determining in principle if Planning Permission will be considered for solar panels as High Kelling is in the AONB. To establish this, it is necessary for applicants to seek pre-planning application advice. This currently

involves a significant fee which we feel could deter applicants. We are raising this with North Norfolk DC.

In May, the Parish Council will be holding the Annual Parish Meeting to which all villagers will be invited. Planning the event is at a preliminary stage, key themes under consideration include housing development in the vicinity, a greener village and the Queen's Jubilee celebrations. Details on the website and in forthcoming issues of the Parish Chronicle.

The Parish Council has reached agreement with the owners of the General Store and Post Office for continued use of a section of their notice board. Regrettably we have not made best use of this previously, something we intend to rectify.

Questions have been asked about shallow excavations in the farmers' fields, Bodham end. We believe these relate to soil sampling etc for the wind turbine cables. At the time of writing (21st March), there appear to be no firm plans for the old Pineheath Care Home, nor the old nursery site. Your Parish Council will continue to monitor the position, suggesting the former may have potential in relation to Ukrainian refugees. The latest information on how to donate to the Ukrainian appeals is on the Parish Council's website, details below.

The Village-wide email arrangement is up and working and has recently included advance warning of the temporary closure of Bridge Rd. If you haven't yet signed up, simply email the Parish Clerk, details below.

Ukrainian Emergency – Our thoughts remain with the people of Ukraine every day. We have placed information on the High Kelling PC website on www.highkellingpc.info. The Parish Clerk will be contacting Duncan Baker MP for a summary of the works undertaken at central government level. Enquiries are being made as to the availability of accommodation for refugees in this area.

A Greener Village

How often over the last two years have you heard someone say “We’re so lucky to live here.....” In High Kelling we are surrounded by trees, can walk into woods on both sides of the main road, and the network of footpaths beyond. We’re also close to the sea and the coastal path. It’s not only nice living here, but our natural environment has also helped to sustain our physical and mental well-being during COVID. We should aim to maintain and support the countryside around us, and we can’t avoid broader issues linked to the climate crisis and the drive to drastically reduce carbon emissions to stave off the worst effects of a changing climate.

The Parish Council

Much of our work is concerned with the quality of our local environment, including litter picks, leaf clearing and planting along the A148 verges. We have applied to Norfolk County Council to designate two commonly used paths as Public Rights of Way so that access will be officially safeguarded; and supported a Tree Preservation Order for the whole village to stop uncontrolled cutting. Improvements to road safety on the A148 - the speed activated sign and the ‘gates’ at each end of the village - also benefit the environment. Information about the toad patrol at Selbrigg pond, free trees, composting and recycling, growing wildflowers and rewilding has featured in the Chronicle.

We support renewable energy, but also wish to protect local communities and the environment. Therefore, we objected to two local onshore wind turbines and continue to argue for an Offshore Transmission Network (a ring main at sea) for wind farms rather than the current practice of cables criss-crossing the Norfolk countryside. Much of the village lies within the North Norfolk Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and we have sought to protect the AONB from unsuitable development and have ensured that North Norfolk's Local Plan has a stronger local voice in the planning process.

The Parish Council intends to gather all this work under the umbrella heading of a 'Green Village' with a long-term commitment to sustaining our natural environment for the people who live here.

What does this mean in practice?

We will expand our existing activities with focus on supporting the environment, including planting for the Queen's Jubilee Celebrations, and considering sustainability and biodiversity when assessing planning applications. The Chronicle and Parish Council website will provide information about energy saving e.g. the item on Warm Homes grants and promote activities such as the Big Garden Birdwatch. We will strengthen links with other village groups including the Village Hall which is developing a plan for the future which includes aiming to boost biodiversity and make the Hall carbon neutral.

News from Your Village Hall



Well spring certainly seems to have sprung this week, although I'm guessing we'll have another cold snap very soon. Still, it's great to see the masses of bulbs around the village, and thanks again to all those involved in supplying and planting – a job well done! Thank you also to Sue Hebburn for her sterling work in tidying the front bed at the hall and keeping the pots by the entrance looking so pretty. Volunteers urgently needed to attack the raised bed at the front next please!

MAINTENANCE

The initial report on the state of the building is now in and it is much as we feared. The rot in the main support beams has spread such that we must now undertake remedial works. Exactly how we make those repairs has yet to be decided, but we must try to complete the work this year. There are a few other urgent but fairly minor points to address, but the building has weathered well considering the type of construction and its age.

Quotes for the major refurbishment of the roadway in front of the hall are slow in coming, but we hope to be able to commit to a supplier in the coming month. The cost is not inconsiderable, and we will be looking for any grant opportunities.

FILM NIGHTS!

I'm very pleased to announce that, with Broom Shed Cinema, we are to trial a couple of Film Nights in our hall. The first film to be shown will be **Stan & Ollie** (rated PG). This is the true-life story of Laurel and Hardy, then the world's greatest comedy team, who face an uncertain future with their golden era of Hollywood films long behind them. The aging duo set out to reconnect with their adoring fans by touring variety halls in Britain in 1953. The shows become an instant hit, but Stan and Ollie can't quite shake off the past as long-buried tension and Hardy's failing health start to threaten their precious partnership. 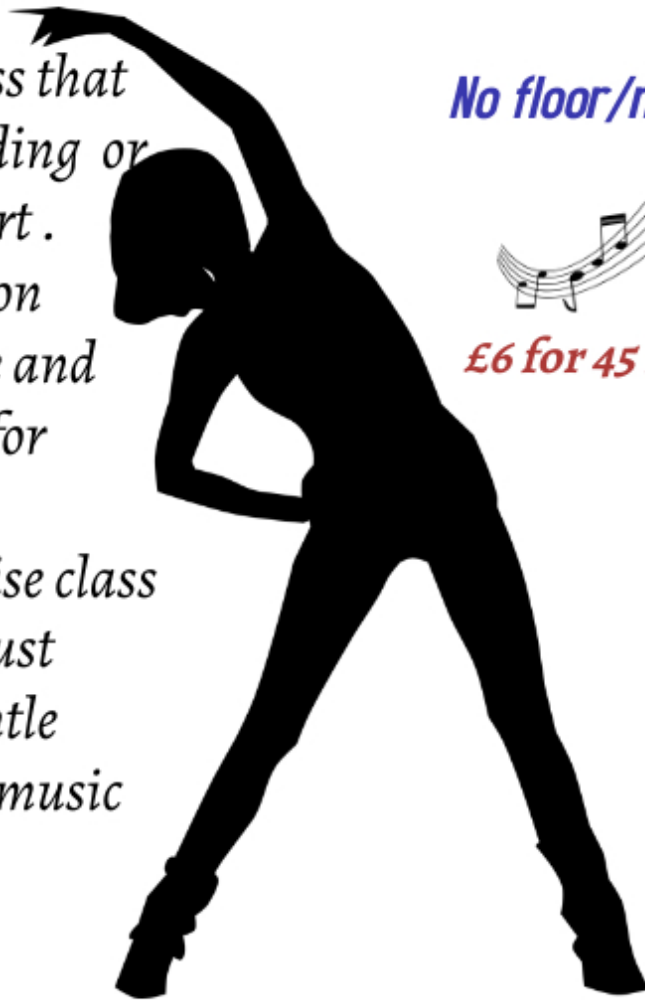

- Healthy 5 – 11 yr olds (now eligible for their 1st dose)

- Booking will be closed over Easter Weekend (Friday 15th – Mon 18th inclusive).

You will not be able to book an appointment before this date, so please do not try.

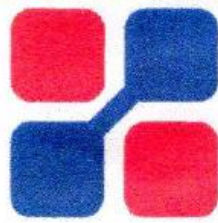
- Appointment times will be staggered to ensure a steady and manageable footfall throughout the clinic.

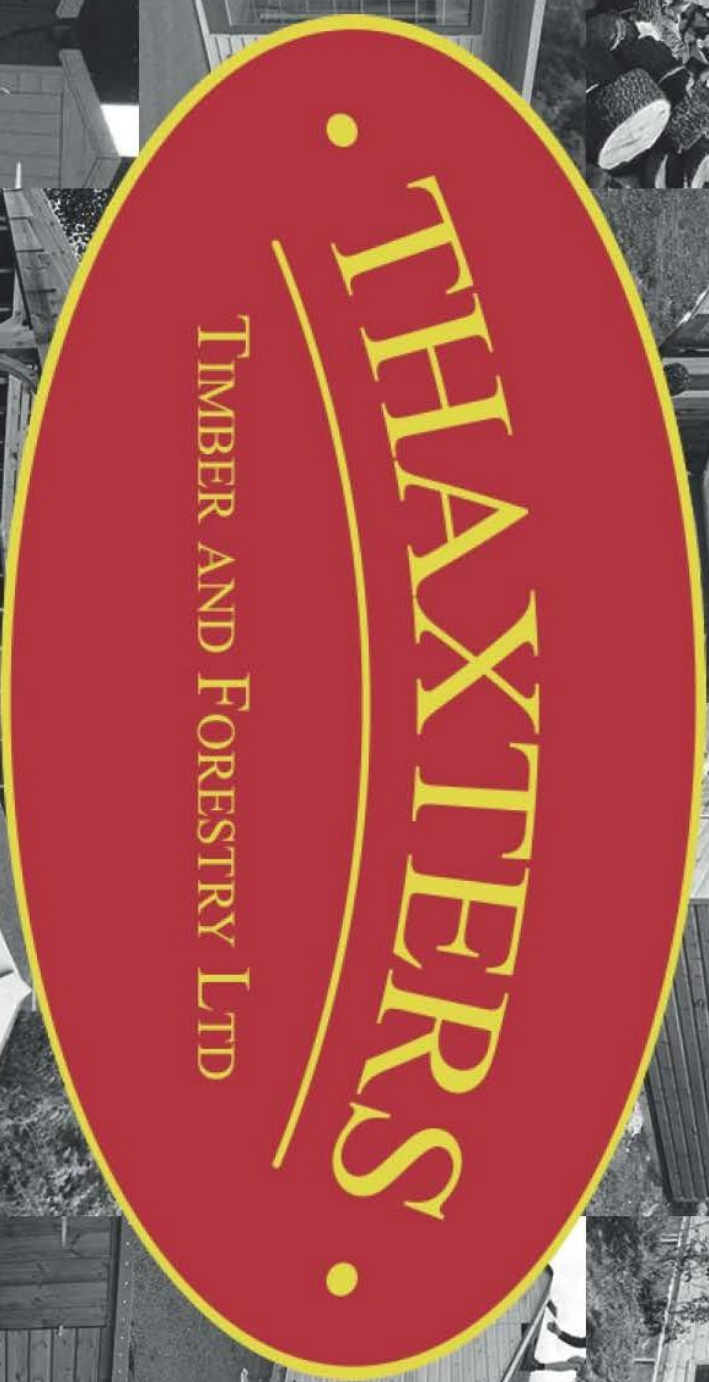
