From your Parish Council

The rise in the Annual Precept

As I mentioned in February's *Chronicle*, the budget for Parish Council services increased from 1st April. The Parish Council debated the amount of the increase needed at a time of other steeply rising household costs, voting by a majority to raise the Annual Precept by an average of around 30 pence per week.



There were a number of reasons for this decision, as detailed below. Whilst in percentage terms this represents a significant increase, in monetary terms it is a far more modest sum – amounting to £15.72 per annum for a Band D property.

The Parish Council has determined to hold a six months' capital reserve to allow for the unexpected. Its previous reserves have been substantially reduced over time by contributions to items such as the provision of the village's second defibrillator, the refurbishment of the village sign, planting along the A148, contributing to repair and maintenance costs for the stretch of road outside the Village Hall and the late Queen's Jubilee celebrations. It has also taken on the provision of this free newsletter following the demise of the High Kelling Society's *High Kelling News*, which has saved previous subscribers to that publication an annual fee of $\pounds 6$. This year the Parish Council has to set aside $\pounds 2,000$ to allow for the possibility of contested election, of which $\pounds 200$ to $\pounds 500$ will be needed for the elections process in any event. In addition, a sum has been set aside for King Charles III's Coronation celebrations, and $\pounds 1,000$ for training new councillors. The necessary provision of clerking services comes to over $\pounds 3,000$ for the year.

May I assure you the Parish Council will continue to look at ways of keeping costs down, including seeking grants and match-funding whenever the opportunity arises, whilst maintaining and - where possible - improving existing services and functions.

The celebration of King Charles III's Coronation

The Coronation of King Charles III on Saturday 6th May will be followed nationally by the Coronation Big Lunch on Sunday 7th and the Big Help Out on Monday 8th. The Parish Council is working with the Village Hall Management Committee and others to hold a Coronation Big (Buffet) Lunch at the Village Hall on the Sunday as advertised elsewhere. Please do buy a ticket and join the celebrations. If you can spare some time to help at the event, please let me know. On the Monday there will be a Village Litter-Pick, followed by free refreshments for pickers and other volunteers who have contributed so much to our village. Please see the advert for the litter-pick for details.

Standing as a Parish Councillor

The deadline for candidate nominations is 4th April 2023. If you have missed the opportunity to seek nomination don't despair just yet! There are nine places on the Parish Council, but if these aren't filled through the election process the Parish Council may seek to do so through co-option. Watch this space. As mentioned above, training will be provided.

The defibrillator outside the Village Store

I am very pleased to advise that this defibrillator is now up and running and registered with the NHS. Training will be offered in its use soon.

Continuing support for the Treehouse Community Fridge

As always, very many thanks to all who donate food, household goods and toiletries at the Village Hall and the Village Store. At least one big box goes weekly from each location to the Treehouse in Charles Rd, Holt. This goes some way to provide help to those in need.

News from Your Village Hall

Hall profitability

As mentioned last month, we needed to review our hire charges and, after a full review of the likely costs for the coming years, we decided that hall hire fees will increase from the 1st September 2023. The increases are, unfortunately, substantial; either 15% or 20%. The current prices have been



in force since January 2020 but we can hold them no longer. All user groups affected have been informed.

Maintenance

Apart from replacing the broken front door handle and the draft excluder on the rear emergency exit doors, there's thankfully little to report. We are investigating ways in which we might improve the outside lighting, whilst mindful of our neighbours and the dark sky area in which we live. We are also exploring the possibility of sanding, repairing and re-finishing the hall floor – it's a while since a team of us scoured and re-varnished it, and some areas are now worn and damaged.

Draw Club

We're approaching the end of this year's draws so it's time to think about rejoining or signing up for the first time. To participate in the coming year's draw your payment of £12 per number must be received by the end of May please. Payments may be made in cash or by a cheque payable to High Kelling Hall Fund. Dear Friends,

The coronation of King Charles III in May will be an historical moment of great significance, which the majority of the population of the UK has never witnessed before. While there will be those who remember the coronation of the late Queen Elizabeth in 1953, it occurred 9 years before I was born and so I look forward with joyful anticipation to celebrating this great historical event.

The coronation takes places in a Christian act of worship in Westminster Abbey, and the essential elements have remained largely unchanged for the past thousand years. The Kings and Queens of England have been anointed and crowned in the Abbey since William the Conqueror, claiming to be the lawful successor of the Saxon King Edward the Confessor, chose to be crowned there on Christmas Day in 1066.

After taking an oath to govern faithfully with mercy and justice, to uphold the Gospel, and to defend the faith of the Church, the King will then be anointed with holy oil, consecrated in Jersualem. It is a significant moment in the coronation ritual as the King is anointed by the Spirit of God, to fulfil his destiny to sit on the throne of our nation. The King will then be invested with royal regalia, crowned and presented to the people with loud cries of "God Save the King".

As far as I am aware the United Kingdom is the only country in Europe to continue to crown their monarchs in such a religious ceremony. Other European Countries simply require their monarch to swear an oath before their legislature in a civic ceremony. I, for one, am pleased that the coronation of our monarch continues to take place in the presence of God, to whom he will be ultimately accountable and I will certainly be praying for him, that God may give him the wisdom and strength to fulfil his duty to the peoples of this nation, and the commonwealth as our King.
