From your Parish Council

am writing this a bit earlier than usual, so please forgive me if there are any subsequent developments regarding the items I'm mentioning.

We hope you will find the Directory, delivered with the November copy of the Parish Chronicle, useful. Amendments and additions will appear in the Chronicle to help you update the information in it.

The planters along the A148 are now nearly all in place and bulbs have been planted. We hope you agree this will make our village even more attractive. Also, it will emphasise to motorists that behind the trees and hedgerows there is a village full of people who walk along its footpaths and drivers who will emerge from its roads onto the A148.

On the matter of footpaths, being Autumn, our recent sweeping of sections has certainly helped. But leaves, wind and the laws of gravity will have their way. May I please ask that if your home borders a public footpath that you regularly clear or cut back any leaves or vegetation arising from your garden that may affect its use? We will be arranging a litter pick and clearance session, hopefully in March next year.

As reported previously, we are working with District and County Councillor Eric Vardy to look at ways of addressing traffic speed and the narrow bridge on Bridge Rd. We understand as far as the bridge is concerned that traffic lights are prohibitively expensive at over £100,000! Alternative electronic signage warning of vehicle on the bridge seems impractical because of a lack of power supply and unsuitability for solar or wind power signage because of the trees etc. The Vice-Chair of the Parish Council will be attending a site visit with Cllr Vardy and the Highways department to look at alternatives and speed limits. More in the next issue and on our website in due course.

We haven't been able to get permission from the Forestry Commission to provide a bench on the footpath alongside the woods at the rear of Pineheath Rd. We are, however, looking at providing one at the junction of the A148 and Selbrigg Rd. Finally, we hope to be able to use our forthcoming village wide email system to give advanced notice of work etc to roads in and running through our village. If you haven't signed up to it, it's not too late. Simply email our Parish Clerk.

On behalf of your Parish Council, may I wish you and yours a very happy Christmas.

The next planned Parish Council meeting is at 7pm, Tuesday 18th January 2022, at the Village Hall.

Update on Windfarms

t has been a while since we brought you an update on windfarm developments around and within our area, but things have been progressing on a number of fronts. We hope to bring you a more indepth look at specific areas in future issues of the Chronicle, but for the moment there are some pertinent things to report:

- The initial Group of 30 or so PCs pushing united support for the ORM, now the OTN, has grown to 82 as local areas are waking up to the fact that the construction and logistics support impact of laying the onshore transmission cables is far reaching, affecting much more than the area adjacent to the cable run itself.
- The Government, to its credit, realised in early 2020 that a better
 way to facilitate the rapid expansion of offshore windfarm
 deployment to meet the 40Gw by 2040 target is to group and
 transmit their outputs together and instigated the Offshore
 Transmission Network Review (OTNR) to investigate and map out a
 workable and cost-effective way of achieving this.
- The proposed timescales for introduction of their proposals have frustrated the Norfolk Parish Movement (of Local Parish Councils) for an OTN. This movement is actively pursuing all parties involved at every webinar and at every consultation, to accept that it can happen faster and must do so if we are to avoid the substantial and

unnecessarily long-term, ever-increasing excavation and disruption of our beautiful county.

Much of the Group's focus of late and that of your Parish Council, is to encourage an earlier implementation of an effective OTN, and we hope that by continually making our case we can have an effect.



POLICE ARE URGING PUBLIC TO INCREASE THEIR VIGILANCE AROUND HOME AND VEHICLE SECURITY

Police are urging the public to increase their vigilance around home and vehicle security with the darker nights.


To prevent the seasonal increase in burglaries and theft from motor vehicles, householders and motorists are asked to follow some simple crime prevention advice to keep their property safe.

Residents should avoid leaving their homes unlit in the evenings, for example, as a house in darkness is more likely to attract the attention of burglars. Vehicles should also ideally be parked in a well-lit and secure place.

If you notice any suspicious activity or believe a crime to be in progress, you are asked to call the police immediately on 999. If you feel that you have information about crimes being committed you can call Crimestoppers anonymously on 0800 555 111.

Online shopping scams cost shoppers £15.4 million over the Christmas period last year.

Data from Action Fraud reveals that **28,049 shoppers were conned out of their money** when shopping online over the Christmas period last year – an increase of almost two thirds (61 per cent) when compared to the same period in the previous year.

Ahead of Black Friday and Cyber Monday, Action Fraud is warning the public to take extra care when shopping online as reports of online shopping fraud have continued to surge.

Carry out research first before buying from a site you don't know. Only create an account if you're going to use that site in the future. Be cautious if the website asks you for details that are not required for your purchase .When it's time to pay for your items, check there's a 'closed padlock' icon in the browser's address bar. Use a credit card when shopping online, if you have one. Most major credit card providers protect online purchases .If you're unsure about a link, don't use the it – go separately to the website. Report suspicious emails you receive by forwarding them to: report@phishing.gov.uk. Report suspicious text messages by forwarding them to: 7726.


