# *From your Parish Council*



**D**ue to unforeseen circumstances we are having to change the arrangements for our meetings in May.

The 17<sup>th</sup> May Parish Council meeting will go ahead as planned, following the Annual Parish Council Meeting, starting at 7pm, Constance Gray Room, at the Village Hall. The Annual Parish Council Meeting will report on the Council's activities over the previous financial year and plans for the year 2022-23, including an opportunity for villagers to comment.

## **An opportunity to speak with a Parish Councillor in private.**

Prior to these meetings one of your Parish Councillors will be available from 6:30pm to discuss with you in private any confidential issues you wish to raise. If you wish to book a session, please do this via the Parish Clerk. If you wish to speak with a specific Parish Councillor, we will do our best to arrange this. This will become a standard feature of the two monthly Parish Council meetings and is in addition to the opportunity to speak at the meeting itself. You can of course make contact with a Parish Councillor direct; details are on our web site.

On the evening of the 24<sup>th</sup> May, we will be hosting the village's Annual Meeting of the Parish. Again, the meeting will start at 7pm, Constance Gray Room. This is not a Parish Council Meeting as such, rather an opportunity for villagers to get together to speak on any issues they wish. Your Parish Councillors will be in attendance to listen to what is said and take any action they feel appropriate. As you will be aware, villagers and trustees of the Village Hall, as well as the Parish Council and All Saints Church, have been planning the Queen's Jubilee Celebrations starting on 3<sup>rd</sup> June. A report on their progress will be included.

## *GREEN VILLAGE*

### Norfolk Warm Homes

North Norfolk District Council, as part of the Norfolk Warm Homes Consortium, has successfully bid for £3.85 million of Government grant to provide energy efficiency improvement works to homes occupied by low-income households. The government grant aims to reduce fuel poverty and harmful greenhouse gas emissions.

Norfolk Warm Homes will use the grant to provide thermal insulation and low carbon heating to replace oil and gas heating systems. Households are eligible if they live in a home with an Energy Performance Certificate (EPC) of D or below and have a gross household income of less than £30,000. The scheme is open to owner-occupiers and landlords of privately rented housing.

In most cases, eligible owner-occupiers will not need to pay anything towards the costs; landlords will pay a minimum of 1/3rd of the cost of works.

## Hedges Not Fences

The Royal Horticultural Society is encouraging us to plant hedges rather than erect fences. Hedges have important environmental benefits: they act as a natural screen; can reduce pollution and improve air quality; slow the flow of rainwater to help flood management; shelter wildlife and regulate temperature. Current research suggest that beech, privet and holly have the best all-round effects.

## Saving Garden Species

The Royal Society for the Protection of Birds has launched a campaign “Nature on your Doorstep” to help reverse the decline of previously common species. Starling numbers have fallen by two-thirds in Britain since the mid-1970s, populations of half of the country’s bumblebee species are falling, and hedgehog numbers have crashed from 30 million

to an estimated 1 million since the 1950s across England, Wales, and Scotland.

One of the easiest things we can do is grow more plants that are good for wildlife, eg:

Sunflowers – beautiful and easy to grow from seed, great for pollinators and a good food source for birds when they set seed.

Cornfield annuals – such as red poppies and blue cornflowers.

Mini-meadow – let part of lawn grow for a few months to encourage meadow flowers.

Lavender – brilliant for bees and butterflies.

Foxgloves – bee magnets.

# *News from Your Village Hall*



**I**t's actually been a pleasure rather than a COVID necessity to have the windows open in the hall this past week or so as the stronger sunshine on the flat roof certainly raises the temperature inside the building.

## **FILM NIGHTS**

Disappointingly, we have had to cancel the proposed start of a Film Night in the hall as there was insufficient take up of tickets. The suggestion for showing films in the hall came from villagers but there actually seems little appetite for such a venture so we have abandoned the idea for now.

## **MAINTENANCE**

We await some further clarification and advice from the consultants who provided the initial inspection report for the building last month. Holidays and other absences have delayed our obtaining their fuller response. Once we are in possession of the final document, we shall be better able to plan the necessary repairs and rectification work.

Many thanks to Andy Baguley and Glenn Houchell for effecting a temporary repair of the pothole on Avenue Road in front of the hall's entrance that had been gradually growing over the past few months. It was becoming quite dangerous, and something had to be done!

**Do you have plumbing, decorating, gardening or DIY skills and the odd bit of free time to volunteer your expertise?** It would be wonderful to have a small pool of able volunteers to assist with the general repairs and maintenance of the building – things such as replacement of the dual flush valve on one of the cisterns, joining a working party to re-treat the external cladding later this year or one to address the proliferation of weeds in the car park? ## **BOOKINGS**

The hall's bookings diary remains healthy although some clubs are still seeking new membership, notably the bridge clubs and short mat bowls. The bowls club has ordered new mats at some considerable expense so

new joiners will have the benefit of learning to play on a pristine surface (albeit on top of a floor that's not quite in that state!)

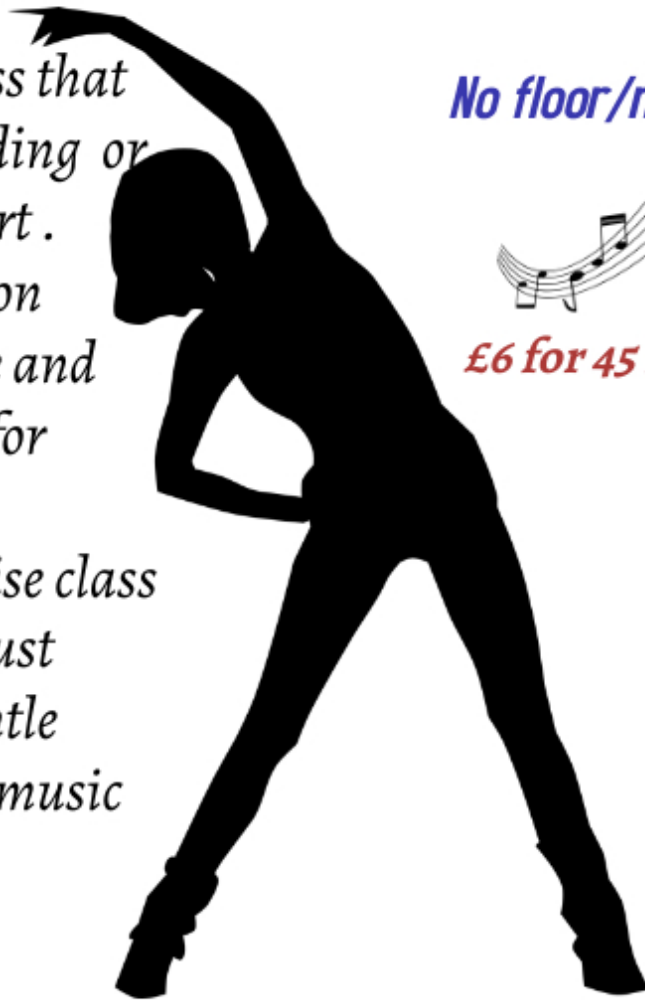

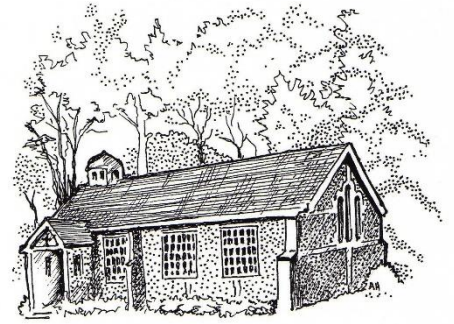
I often have people say that they come along for the social and fun element of the class as much as the exercise! That's fine by me!!

Dear Friends,

Some people may ask what does the parish priest do? Well, there is of course, the obvious: prayer, worship, preaching, teaching, weddings, baptisms, funerals, home visiting, administering to the sick and dying, attending meetings etc, but then there is less obvious, such a being elected onto the local Scout Group executive, chair of the Holt Lowes Trustees, a member of the Greening Holt Group and involvement in the local primary school.

Having just returned from my Easter break, I have just spent two days in Holt Community Primary School leading a prayer space, with others from the parish and the wider deanery. Using the parable of the Good Samaritan, the theme of the interactive, child friendly, prayer space was, learning to love our neighbour as ourselves. Hands on activities posed some difficult questions about saying sorry for the times we have been unkind, how can we help someone in need, be it someone being bullied in school, or a refugee fleeing conflict; what might it feel like to be homeless; what would you take with you if you had to leave your home in a hurry and how do we feel about yourself. It was wonderful to see children of all ages engaging with questions about God, Jesus, love, acceptance, compassion, kindness and enjoying the safe and prayerful space we had created. Their honesty and simplicity and their awareness

of the need to help one another and be kind was refreshing. The young have much to teach us in a world that is sadly so divided and torn apart. If only we could learn from them!

### BEWARE TAX REBATE SCAMS

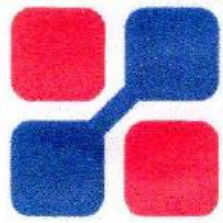
Scammers are cold-calling people asking for their bank details to receive the government's £150 energy rebate.
