## From your Parish Council



Parish Chronicle. Thanks, as always to the contributors, the advertisers who fund it, and to Cllr Susan Rutherford and Susan Ruru who make it possible.

The End-of-Summer litter-pick morphed into a bulb-planting and pathclearing event. Great to have around 20 villagers and Parish Councillors contributing their time and effort, and enjoying the reward of a cuppa and bacon buttie. More on this elsewhere in the Parish Chronicle and on the Parish Council's website <u>www.highkellingpc.info</u>. Not forgetting, thanks to the Village Hall for its use.

In addition to bulb-planting, you will have seen planters popping up along the A148 as it runs through our village. We hope they will not only add to the attractiveness of our village but also reinforce to motorists that this is a village and we frequently use the footpaths which are so close to the road. Also, as drivers, we have to exit from side roads etc onto the A148. It's one of the measures we are taking to promote road safety. Planters at the village gates have been donated by the High Kelling General Store and Post Office, bulbs by the Holt Garden Centre and help with other planters along the road by Edgefield Nurseries. Thanks to those who have given their time planting the daffodil bulbs.

On the matter of speeding, this continues to be a problem on Bridge Rd, as is the difficulty negotiating the twisting road and the narrow bridge over the railway. Unfortunately, some motorists seem to regard the 60 mph speed limit signs as a requirement to drive at that speed! Vehicles meeting on the bridge requiring one to reverse are not infrequent. In addition, Bridge Rd doesn't have any footpaths and the increasing number of users of the Holt RF Club overflow car park also have to cross this road to get to the Club House and pitches. We will be discussing this matter at our November Parish Council Meeting. County and District Cllr Eric Vardy is pressing Norfolk CC for improvements and will be providing an update. Our Council meetings are, of course, open to the public, there being an opportunity to comment on this and indeed any other matter.

The 2021 High Kelling Directory has been printed and a free copy will be distributed to all households in our village. Thanks to Cllr Gordon Lane and our Parish Clerk for all their work on this. If, for any reason, you missed the opportunity to be included and are happy for your details to be circulated, contact the Parish Clerk.

t was good to see that my crystal ball's prediction of success at the Macmillan Coffee Morning was accurate – well done to Lyn Morgan and all involved.

Oddly, October saw a wasp invasion in the village hall. There were hundreds of them coming in via an air vent. Fortunately, they were the most docile wasps I've ever encountered, so no human casualties. Peter Rutherford and I have planted



#### Dear Friends,

November begins and ends with glorious feast days. On 1<sup>st</sup> Nov, keep the feast of All Saints when we honour those holy men and women whom the church declares as Saints and to whom the church here in High Kelling is dedicated. The Saints are those who in life and sometimes in death have borne witness to the love of God. They provide us with an example to follow and, from their place in the glory of heaven; they surround us as we journey through this life. One such Saint was of course St Andrew the Apostle, whose feast day ends the month. An apostle of Christ and the brother of St Peter, St Andrew was thought to have been crucified in Patras in Greece around 60AD. The Parish Church in Holt is dedicated to him. As well as these two Saints days, we also keep the feast of All Souls on the 2<sup>nd</sup> November and Remembrance Sunday on the 14<sup>th</sup> November. These two days are opportunities to remember before God our own departed loved ones and those who gave their lives in the service of our country. In doing so, we can give thanks for those we love but see no longer and for the sacrifice so many made for the freedoms we enjoy today. November may mark the onset of winter and remind us of those we have loved and lost, yet as we honour the Saints it also contains the sure and certain hope of future glory in our eternal home in heaven.

## Police promote road safety as darker nights set in

"No-one should be taking any chances, putting the lives of themselves or other road users in danger."

Police are warning drivers to be prepared for the change in conditions as the clocks go back on Sunday 31 October. Collisions tend to increase in October and November with the driver error of failing to look properly being the biggest contributing factor along with losing control and poor manoeuvring.

Operation Dark Nights will see officers carrying out roadside checks throughout the next month, focusing on defect offences involving lights, tyres, windscreens and screen wash, and anything else which may impact on the roadworthiness of a vehicle.

It is important that all drivers check their vehicle regularly to ensure it is road worthy. Please prepare for the winter months by checking that both your lights and your windscreen wipers are working, that your tyres are correctly inflated and have the correct tread depth and that your windscreen wash is regularly topped up.

## A rubbish time was had by all

Around 20 volunteers from the Parish Council and the village attended the early winter combined litter pick/path clearance/ bulb planting session, using our recently purchased equipment and hi-viz jackets. The village was scoured for litter and such like from east to west, north to south, from village gates to village gates. Special attention was given to the area around the general store, both sides of the A148 and Selbrigg and Bridge Rds.

The footpath, where it splits from the cycle path outside Voewood and the newly renovated section of the path between Avenue and Vale Rds, were cleared of debris. A big thankyou to the Serco refuse driver who stopped and took away the eight or so heavy bags of earth and vegetation from the latter.

Cllr Susan Rutherford and husband, Peter, took the opportunity to plant hundreds of daffodil bulbs along the A148 as part of our drive to reinforce speed limits by emphasising it's a residential area. More bulbs and planters will follow.

At the end of the session, all reconvened at the Village Hall to enjoy bacon butties and hot drinks, and generally socialise.

An overall enjoyable morning in a very good cause. Thanks to the usual suspects plus the new joiners.




# A £5m cancer unit which will save patients a 25-mile journey has opened.
