## From your Parish Council

elcome to the September issue of the High Kelling Parish Chronicle. There wasn't a Parish Council meeting in August but still a few issues to report on.

After over 50 years, the High Kelling Society was formally wound up at its AGM on 23<sup>rd</sup> June, with it generously agreeing a donation of £500 for future upkeep and planting at the Village Sign. Ex-members of the Society are also hoping to continue its maintenance on an ad hoc basis. This complements the recent Parish Council funded refurbishment of the sign. First erected on 20th October 2000, it is now back in place in its full glory! A big thank you to the Society and all concerned.

Your Parish Council has confirmed its interest in acquiring the shortly to be redundant phone box adjacent to the Village Store. Our initial thoughts were an information point for villagers and possibly a second village defibrillator because of its prime location. With the latter idea in mind, the High Kelling Society has kindly also donated £1,000 for the purchase of the defibrillator. I'm sure you will join with me in thanking the Society for this further donation.

Since our last report, extensive pothole and road repairs have been carried out in Bridge Rd, especially alongside the grass verges. Also, the Anglian Water small manhole at the junction of the A148 with Vale Rd, mentioned in the last issue, has been attended to. This involved closure of one lane of the A148. One issue I intend to raise at the next Parish Council meeting was the use of traffic lights serving only traffic on the A148 for this latter repair. These lights were not visible from Vale Rd. A third set of lights controlling access onto the A148 would have made it far safer, especially when turning left. Earlier notification of work likely to affect traffic flow would also greatly help villagers. Something we will take up with the relevant authorities.

I hope, like my fellow Councillors and myself, you made it to the Village Hall Table Top Sale on 21<sup>st</sup> August. Great to see our Hall once more hosting events. Big thank you to John Kellas-Kelly and fellow Manage-ment Committee members, with special thanks also to Ruth Wilson for all her work.

Last, but by no means least, interviewing the two candidates who have applied to be co-opted onto your Parish Council is taking place at the end of August.



# HIGH KELLING SOCIETY - AGM 2021

he High Kelling Society AGM was held on Friday, 23 June 2021 at 2:15 pm at the Village Hall, High Kelling.

The Minutes of the last AGM held on 12 April 2019 were distributed. It was acknowledged that much has occurred in the interim and the last Minutes are now more or less an historical document. The minutes were proposed by John Kellas-Kelly, seconded by Gordon Lane, and signed by Brian Shaw.

Graham Harris distributed the Treasurer's Report showing a £6,000 balance and a discussion was held around distribution of funds. Proposals (see below) were accepted, but should Proposal 6 not materialise (placing a defibrillator in the HK phone box), it was agreed that the £1000 allocated would be added to the Poppy Club donation. The bank account will be maintained until all the funds are distributed. The Treasurer's Report was proposed by Lyn Morgan and seconded by Gordon Lane. The vote in favour was unanimous.

Brian Shaw presented his Chair Report highlighting events occurring for the HKS since the last AGM:

- The Macmillan Coffee Morning in 2019 raised £935
- Tresall Catering took over the lunches in November 2019 and provided a successful Christmas Lunch. However, due to dwindling numbers of attendees and the onset of Covid, the lunches stopped in early 2020.
- The 2020 AGM had to be postponed.
- The HKN Souvenir Edition, published in October 2019, celebrated 50 years of the High Kelling Society and News (1<sup>st</sup> issue published 1 October 1970). Thanks were given to Susan Ruru for its compilation.
- As a result of dwindling subscriptions, it was agreed to cease publication of the High Kelling News with the last issue distributed in December 2020. Discussions held with the Parish Council resulted in their agreeing to take over the publication of a new magazine, entitled the High Kelling Parish Chronicle, with HKS transferring the

balance of advertising funds to the Parish Council. Gordon Lane advised that the Parish Council will also take on the production of the High Kelling Directory.

- The HKS continues to maintain the area around the Village Sign, with members hoping to continue this on an ad hoc basis.
- The redundant printer, after various offers were refused, has now been returned to the copier supplier without any cost to the HKS.

Brian Shaw ended his report by thanking all current and past members of the committee, as well as everyone who over the years contributed to making the HKS and HKN an integral part of the village.

The Chair proposed that since the main functions of the HKS have now been disbanded, that the Society should be wound up and all serving officers to stand down. Proposed by Trisha Hickey, seconded by Oscar Haynes. Unanimous vote in favour.

As there was no other business, the Chair thanked everyone for attending and closed the meeting at 14:55.


